ORDINANCE NO. 2019-O-25

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
CENTENNIAL, COLORADO, AMENDING SECTION 8-1-30 OF
THE CENTENNIAL MUNICIPAL CODE CONCERNING
PARKING RESTRICTIONS FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLES,
COMMERCIAL VEHICLES, AND MOTOR VEHICLES**

WHEREAS, pursuant to its home rule authority and Section 31-15-401, C.R.S., for purposes of promoting health, safety, morals, and the general welfare of the community, the City Council has the authority to create laws that prevent and suppress activities that could prove harmful to the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens, and pass and enforce all necessary police ordinances; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its home rule authority and Section 31-15-702(1)(a)(I), C.R.S., the City is authorized to regulate the use of streets; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 42-1-102(48), C.R.S., the City has the authority to adopt local police regulations under the constitution and laws of the State of Colorado; and

WHEREAS, as codified in Chapter 8 of the City Municipal Code, the City has adopted the 2003 edition of the Model Traffic Code as promulgated by the Colorado Department of Transportation by reference, with certain amendments thereto; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 2015-O-12, the City previously amended the Model Traffic Code with the addition of a new Section 1212 for regulation of parking in residential districts and codified at Section 8-1-30(15) of the Centennial Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, since the adoption of Ordinance 2015-O-12, the City Council desires to amend Section 1212 of the Model Traffic Code to further regulate motor vehicle parking on public streets and highways in residential districts; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the adoption of this Ordinance will further the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CENTENNIAL,
COLORADO, ORDAINS:**

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are affirmed and incorporated herein by this reference as findings of the City Council.

Section 2. **Amendment of the Title of Section 1212 of the Model Traffic Code as codified in Section 8-1-30(15).** The title of Section 1212 of the Model Traffic Code as codified

in subsection (15) of Section 8-1-30 of the Centennial Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

1212. Parking restrictions for recreational vehicles, recreational trailers, commercial vehicles, and motor vehicles.

Section 3. Amendment of Section 1212 of the Model Traffic Code as codified in Section 8-1-30(15) with the adoption of two new subsections (2)(d) and (2)(e). Section 1212 of the Model Traffic Code as codified in Section 8-1-30(15) is amended with the adoption of two new subsections (2)(d) and (2)(e) to read as follows:

(2) The following restrictions shall apply to parking vehicles on public rights-of-way in residential districts anywhere within the boundaries of the City of Centennial:

(d) No motor vehicle shall be parked or stored on any public street or highway within any residential district for a period of greater than fourteen (14) consecutive days.

(e) A new up to fourteen (14) consecutive day period allowed by subsection (2)(d) is never initiated without an intervening minimum seven (7) consecutive day period from the conclusion of the previous up to fourteen (14) consecutive day period, during which time the motor vehicle must be removed from and remain off of the public street or highway.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance should be found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining portions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid portion, provided that such remaining portions or applications of this Ordinance are not determined by the court to be inoperable. The City Council declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, despite the fact that any one or more section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion would be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 5. Repeal. Any and all ordinances or codes or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent herewith are, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, hereby repealed; provided, however, that the repeal of any such ordinance or code or part thereof shall not revive any other section or part of any ordinance or code heretofore repealed or superseded and this repeal shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any person for any act done or committed in violation of any ordinance hereby repealed prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Effective Date. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, the provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after publication following final passage.
